Subject:- **MULTILATERAL TRAINING PROGRAMS IN AGRICULTURE AREA UNDER CHINA AID IN SEPTEMBER 2025**

The Economic Affairs Division vide its O.M No.2(1)EA/CHINA-II/2025 dated 1st August, 2025 states that Government of People's Republic of China has offered Multilateral Seminars, in Agriculture area for the month of September, 2025 for Officers of Government of Pakistan (List and program details are attached). The Chinese side has further informed that candidates cannot be withdrawn once nominated and the final application result will be subject to the MOFCOM. The Government of Pakistan will not be liable to bear any cost. The candidate will follow code of conduct (Annex-I). The requisite general requirements are as under:-

Eligibility Criteria:

- Officers (BS-17 & above) of this Division most relevant to the training programmes.
- Proficiency in English.
- Under 45 for officials or under director's level; Under 50 for officials at director general's level.
- Contract Employees are not eligible.

- Application Form with personal signature and photo (Original & Copy)
- Information Form with personal signature and photo (Original & Copy)
- Copy of Passport at least six months of remaining validity and blank visa pages

- No criminal record certificate or Police Clearance Certificate attested by Ministry of Foreign Affairs of Pakistan, if not visited China within 5 years
- FTC Proforma
- Copy of CNIC
- Surety Bond on stamp paper (Original)
- Undertaking on stamp paper (Original)
- No Objection Certificate (Provide within two days after selection)

Officers of Finance Division, who fulfill the given eligibility criteria, are requested to furnish their nominations duly recommended by the AFS/head of the Wing concerned alongwith required documents to QA-I Section by 8.8.2025. For further details/ information/ forms / FTC Proforma are available at EAD's website: www.ead.gov.pk.

Note:- "In addition to the eligibility criteria specified for a training, all officers who are working on contract basis/fixed pay package or having less than two years continuous government service or less than three months of service in Finance Division or against whom disciplinary proceedings/inquiry is in progress, may need not apply".

About the Organizer	<p>Yunnan International Center for Economic and Technical Exchanges (YICETE), as a public institution directly under the Department of Commerce of Yunnan Province, was approved as a training base for international business officials by the Ministry of Commerce of the PRC in 2014. ? Training content	<p>1. Introduction to the main lectures</p> <p>Government officials, experts, and scholars with rich experience in poverty reduction and rural revitalization are invited to deliver lectures on specialized theoretical knowledge. Through interactive discussions, participants are encouraged to share their regional experience and challenges to facilitate knowledge exchange. The lectures cover the following aspects:</p> <p>(I) Special Lectures (Public Courses)</p> <p>(1) Overview of China's National Conditions and Yunnan Province: This section introduces China's history, economy, and culture. Additionally, an introduction to the geography, history, ethnicity, economy, and other aspects of Yunnan is provided to help participants understand the characteristics of China and Yunnan.</p> <p>(2) Xi Jinping Thought on Diplomacy and China's Diplomacy in the New Era: This section will focus on building a community with a shared future for mankind, the Belt and Road Initiative, and the principles of extensive consultation, joint contribution, and shared benefits, discussing China's responsibilities and commitments in global governance.</p> <p>(II) Special Lectures (Professional Courses)</p> <p>(1) China's Solution to Eradicating Absolute Poverty and Yunnan's Practice: This section introduces China's successful experiences and cases in targeted poverty alleviation and rural</p>	

revitalization since the reform and opening-up. It discusses how China's experiences could inspire and be adopted in the poverty reduction strategies of Indian Ocean Rim countries, equipping participants with knowledge to learn from China's achievements in reducing poverty and revitalizing rural areas.

(2) **Paths and Models for Rural Industrial Revitalization:** This section examines successful cases of rural industrial revitalization in China and discusses the industrial poverty alleviation models and sustainable development paths suitable for Indian Ocean Rim countries. It will help participants gain a deeper understanding of the current state of industrial poverty alleviation in Indian Ocean Rim countries and explore development paths more effectively.

(3) **Agricultural Cooperation and Poverty Alleviation Practices in South and Southeast Asia:** This section introduces China's poverty alleviation endeavors within the agricultural cooperation frameworks with South Asian and Southeast Asian countries. The discussion will cover the vital role and challenges of regional cooperation in advancing poverty reduction, providing participants with insights into China's successful experiences in international collaboration on agricultural poverty alleviation.

(4) **Baofeng Model for Succulent Flowers Supporting Shared Prosperity of Resettlement Villages:** This section introduces the development trajectory of the Baofeng model in resettlement villages, demonstrating how the succulent flower industry aids these villages in attaining shared prosperity and fosters rural revitalization.

(5) **Pursuing Innovation in Rural Revitalization—The Growth Journey of New Farmers:** This section illustrates how new farmers can leverage modern technology and management approaches to encourage agricultural progress and rural enhancement while preserving traditional agricultural heritage, highlighting the contributions and roles of women in these processes. It encourages Lao participants to foster a new generation of farmers for the purpose of rural revitalization, advance agricultural modernization, and achieve sustainable rural development.

(6) **China's Economic Reform and Rural Anti-poverty Strategy:** This section examines China's economic reform strategies and their implementation from 1978 to 2000, with a focus on the implementation and effectiveness of rural anti-poverty strategies. It highlights the relationship between economic development and poverty reduction, as well as the critical role of women in this process.

(7) **Opening-up, Globalization and Reconstruction of Asian Production Networks—China's Foreign Trade Development Process and Experience:** This lecture introduces China's foreign trade development process and experience based on China's opening-up policy and the reconstruction of Asian production networks in the context of globalization, and provides new ideas and new driving forces for global development by analyzing and summarizing past experience.

(8) **Yunnan's Construction of Channels Connecting to the Indian Ocean and Its Opening-up:** This section explores how Yunnan leverages its geographical advantages to strengthen infrastructure development in transportation and logistics, foster economic cooperation and cultural exchange with the Indian Ocean region, enhance the level of opening-up, and advance regional co-development.

(9) **Evaluation and Enhancement Mechanisms for China's Poverty Reduction Policies:** This section encompasses an introduction to the historical context, theoretical foundations, policy frameworks, and practical achievements of China's poverty reduction initiatives. It offers an in-depth analysis of evaluation methods, practical outcomes, and existing challenges faced by poverty reduction policies, particularly during the stages of poverty elimination and achievements consolidation and expansion. Through a blend of theoretical study, case analyses, methodological training, and international comparisons, it equips participants with the skills to scientifically assess complex social policies.

(10) **China's Experience in Economic Development and Poverty Reduction:** This section introduces China's achievements, policies, tools, and models for poverty reduction during its economic development. It intertwines theoretical knowledge with real-world cases to demonstrate China's effective poverty alleviation through economic growth, helping participants comprehend the close relationship and significant influence between economic development and poverty reduction.

(11) **China's Rural Land System:** This section explores Yunnan's multi-dimensional approaches under the rural revitalization strategy, focusing on aspects such as ecological

agriculture, ethnic culture, and ecological resources.

2. Visits and discussions

This Seminar intends to conduct visits and investigations in Kunming and Guiyang. In Guizhou Province, participants will visit the Guizhou Provincial Rural Revitalization Administration to study provincial-level policy coordination, innovation, and mechanisms for preventing a return to poverty. They will visit the research center at the Guizhou University of Finance and Economics to gain an in-depth understanding of poverty reduction theories and outcomes and strategies for equalizing public services. They will also explore Haique Village in Hezhang County to observe firsthand the integrated approach of ecological governance, grassroots Party building, and poverty alleviation for prosperity. In Kunming City, participants will visit Shiqiao Village in Jinning District to observe cultural and tourism integration and the development of characteristic agriculture under the "village-enterprise connection" model. They will visit Yanta Village in Anning City to learn about its revitalization of industries through "intangible cultural heritage + tourism" practices and experience in cultural heritage preservation. They will also have a discussion with the Kunming Bureau of Agriculture and Rural Affairs to systematically learn about agricultural modernization policies and rural governance systems. These locations constitute a comprehensive matrix of rural revitalization experiences, encompassing policy design, academic research, grassroots practices, industrial innovation, cultural empowerment, and government coordination. They provide participants from Indian Ocean Rim countries with context-specific and multi-faceted developmental insights.
